

The Kiwanis International Foundation Board of Trustees approved these grants at its January 2012 meeting in New Orleans, Louisiana:

Kiwanis Club of Carthage, Missouri – Sharing a Blessing Vitamin Distribution: This vitamin distribution program in Guatemala will aid more than 350 children who live in unsanitary conditions in a ghetto of Guatemala City. Parasites, unclean water and infectious diseases are a part of the local environment. Protecting the children's basic immunity will help prevent physical problems and lessen the impact of periodic illnesses.

Kiwanis Club of Citrus Heights, California – Kiwanis Family House: Families will receive assistance with rental fees at the Kiwanis Family House, a temporary residence for families whose children are being treated for life-threatening illnesses or traumatic injury at the UC Davis Medical Center or Shriners Hospital for Children in Sacramento, California.

Kiwanis Club of Douglas, Georgia – Children Priority One (car seats) – Provides infants and children with age appropriate car seats.

Kiwanis Club of Fort Vancouver, Washington – Fort Vancouver Nature Camp: This grant will provide children of servicemen and women who are on active duty the camp experience.

Kiwanis Club of Indian River, Michigan – Dream Project in Pemba, Mozambique: The Dream Project is a family-style orphanage that was established to meet the physical, emotional, intellectual, vocational and spiritual needs of abandoned and impoverished children. Children learn to recognize and develop their talents and gifts. The project's goal is to equip the children in their care to become future leaders.

Kiwanis Club of Olympia, Washington – Food Bank Garden Student Project: This project engages hundreds of elementary and high school students in learning about community based agriculture and community service by raising organic vegetables for the Thurston County Food Bank.

Kiwanis Club of Sammamish, Washington – EX3 Teen & Recreation Center: The former Sammamish library has been transformed into a teen center that serves teens in grades 6-12 after school hours. This center provides a multi-purpose room, study lounge, performance stage, tech lab, teaching kitchen, and game room.

Kiwanis Club of Twin City, North Carolina – Children of Vietnam Parasite Prevention Program: This grant will provide a low-cost and very effective parasite prevention treatment program to approximately 30,500 children living in Hoa Vang, located in Central Vietnam. Funds will cover the costs of Mebandazole and distribution twice a year.

Philippines South District – Kiwanis Feeding Program: This grant will help the club provide rice and medicine to the malnourished children in remote destitute villages, ages 6 years old or younger whose malnutrition status are below normal levels. This grant will help provide by providing a feeding program three times a week.

Kiwanis International – Aktion Club International Convention: This grant will support the Aktion Club International Convention by helping to fund lodging, meals, materials and speakers.

Kiwanis International – CKI Leadership Academy: Grant funding will directly grow CKI Leadership Academy, one of the signature programs of Circle K International.

Kiwanis International – Key Leader: Kiwanis International Foundation has been instrumental in the development of Key Leader, a signature program of Kiwanis International. Many program participants are members and officers of Key Club or Builders Club and use their learning to advance their clubs. Key Leader is a great way for Kiwanis clubs to reach out to youth in their communities.

The Kiwanis International Foundation Board of Trustees approved these grants at its July 2011 meeting in Geneva, Switzerland:

Kiwanis Club of Belton, Texas – Shillong Children’s Center: The Shillong Children’s Center services children internally displaced across India by armed conflict, generalized violence and human rights violations.

Kiwanis Club of Gig Bear Valley, California - Teacher Supply Kits: This project provides local elementary schools the essential school supplies no longer provided by the school district due to budget cuts.

Kiwanis Club of Dover-Foxcroft, Maine – Backpack Program: The backpack program provides a backpack full of nutritious, kid friendly food each Friday for 40 children during the school year.

Kiwanis Club of Federal Way, Washington – Project Honduras: This grant will provide much needed medicine, protein based foods and some very needed shoes for children in Honduras to prevent parasites from entering the feet, causing malnutrition and even death.

Kiwanis Club of Glendora Kiwaniannes, California – Fingerprinting Kindergartners: The program provides services to the Police Auxiliary to aid in fingerprinting the kindergarten children at five local elementary schools.

Kiwanis Clubs of Hickory & West Catawba, North Carolina – Child Sexual Abuse Prevent-A-Thon: The Children’s Advocacy Center trains adults in this county on how to protect children from child sexual abuse. This program teaches adults to recognize, react and report abuse and will help over 60,000 children in this community.

Kiwanis Club of Red Wing Satellite Club, Minnesota – Impact Lives Food Packaging: During a one day food packaging event, 19 local Kiwanians and 88 correctional facility residents packaged 35,640 meals which were shipped to Somalia and Haiti to feed needy children and their families.

Kiwanis Club of Salem, Illinois – Regular Attendance Program: The regular attendance program will increase student attendance by decreasing the obstacles that lead to poor attendance such as limited food, hygiene products, cleaning supplies, lack of shoes and clothing.

Kiwanis Club of Shawnee, Kansas – Shawnee Community Services: The Shawnee Community Services offers a hand up to families within the community that are in need of food, clothing and emergency financial assistance for shelter and utilities. They serve over 2,500 children and their families. This grant will help supply food to the Shawnee Community Services.

Kiwanis Club of Twin City, North Carolina – Children of Vietnam: This grant will provide a low-cost and very effective parasite prevention treatment program to approximately 30,500 children living in Danang, located in Central Vietnam. Funds will cover the costs of Mebandazole and distribution twice a year.

Kiwanis Club of Warsaw, Indiana – Kids Athletic Day 2011: The Kids Athletic Day is a free, fun; athletic event for event for children ages 6-12. This club holds this one day event in hopes of providing emphasis on reducing childhood obesity and diabetes by increasing activity.

Kiwanis Club of West Branch, Michigan – Ogemaw Boys & Girls Club: This latch key program for first through sixth graders is an after school program that will provide young people with recreation, study time, crafts, arts, computers and supervision.

Kiwanis Club of Westfield, Massachusetts – Supper Club: This Kiwanis Club provides a supper club for over 1,500 youth members between the ages of 5-18. They provide a nutritious meal to these young members since February 2011.

Switzerland-Liechtenstein District – SPARANZA Project: SPERANZA is a vocational program that assists over 1,000 young students within Switzerland. The program aims the integration into employment for children after completing their basic education.

The Kiwanis International Foundation Board of Trustees approved these grants at its January 2011 meeting in Indianapolis, Indiana:

Kiwanis Club of Benicia, California—AEDs for Schools: More than 1,200 children will benefit from four additional automated external defibrillators (AEDs) and cabinets, which will provide the Benicia school system with the recommended number of AEDs.

Kiwanis Club of Berne, Switzerland—Manjughoksha Academy: The project provides school books, educational material and school uniforms for children at the Manjughoksha Academy in Kathmandu, Nepal.

Kiwanis Club of Brunswick, Georgia—Ferst Foundation for Childhood Literacy: Nearly 700 children's lives will be enhanced in Glynn County, Georgia, by Ferst Foundation, which provides free books to children from birth to age five.

Kiwanis Club of Chatsworth, California—Autoclave Honduras: Kiwanians are saving lives in Honduras by helping to provide autoclaves—sterilizers for instruments and equipment that can be used more than once to eradicate germs and viruses on any item or surface.

Kiwanis Club of Faribault, Minnesota—Basic Blessings backpack program: Thanks to the grant, food will continue to be provided to 100 students every weekend—sent home in a backpack so that children on the free meal program will not go hungry.

Kiwanis Club of George, Iowa—Crayons for Haiti: Thanks to Kiwanians in George, Iowa, more than 65,000 students in 315 mission schools receive basic school supplies such as crayons, pencils, pens, rulers and paper. The Kiwanis International Foundation assisted with the supplies' shipping costs.

Kiwanis Club of Rapid City, South Dakota—Shoes for Kids: Grant funds will help purchase shoes and socks for more than 350 needy children from preschool to eighth grade in the Rapid City School system.

Pacific Northwest District Key Club—SIGN: This grant will be used to open a Surgical Implant Generation Network (SIGN) clinic and program in Tanzania and provide the new program with onsite training and a full supply of SIGN instrumentation and implants.

Philippine South District—Kiwanis Book Bank: The grant will be used for shipping and delivery costs of books to various book bank sites, and to purchase additional books and supplies.

The Kiwanis International Foundation Board of Trustees approved these grants at its June 2010 meeting in Las Vegas, Nevada:

Capital District—Initiative for Africa: The Capital District, Kiwanis International Foundation and KickStart's Initiative for Africa will help more than 300 families in Western Kenya lift themselves out of poverty. Grant funds will be used to promote farming as a profitable and inspirational business.

Kiwanis Club of Carthage, Missouri—Sharing A Blessing: This vitamin distribution program in Guatemala will aid more than 350 children who live in unsanitary conditions in a ghetto of Guatemala City. Parasites, unclean water and infectious diseases are a part of the local environment. Protecting the children's basic immunity will help prevent physical problems and lessen the impact of periodic illnesses.

Kiwanis Club of Douglas, Georgia—Children Priority One project: More than 250 car seats for infants will be available to new parents leaving the hospital, and to the local health department. Parenting information will also be given to new parents, in formats that include DVDs.

Kiwanis Club of Federal Way, Washington—Projecto Honduras: Grant funds will help provide Hondurans with a free medical clinic and malaria-control center, along with assistance in education, housing, goods and social development.

Kiwanis Club of Huron, South Dakota—The Pancake House: The local restaurant will receive 30 new molded plastic-top folding tables and 200 metal folding chairs.

Kiwanis Club of Northshore of Mandeville, Louisiana—Keep Dentistry Alive for Children in Granada, Nicaragua: Supplies and educational materials will be provided to a preventive program that serves children in clinics beginning at the age of five and six.

Kiwanis Club of Palo Alto, California—Tapulao School Breakfast Nutrition Program: Working with the Philippine Luzone District, the program will continue to provide nutritional breakfasts to the underweight children in the community of Tapulao, Philippines. The funding will help increase the program's service, which already provides more than 700 breakfasts per day.

Kiwanis Club of Sion Valais, Switzerland—St. Raphael Institut in Champlan: This welcome center serves low-income parents whose children have been hospitalized for an extended period. Funding will help purchase furniture and equipment to accommodate more than 50 guest families.

Kiwanis Club of Spearfish, South Dakota—Dakota Smiles Mobile Dental Clinic: This mobile dental clinic provides free care to underserved children during its stop in the Spearfish community.

Kiwanis Club of Steamboat Springs, Colorado—Medical Equipment Shipment: The Steamboat Springs Kiwanis Club will send medical supplies and equipment to the children's hospitals in Bitola and Orhid, Macedonia.

Kiwanis Club of Warsaw, Indiana: All Kids Athletic Day: Children aged six through twelve will compete in fun events such as archery, trampoline, races and relays.

Chaminade Julianne Key Club, Ohio - Believe in Belize –

Kiwanis Club of Bismarck, North Dakota – Medical Center Children's Unit Fun Center – A new entertainment unit will be provided to this Medical Center for children to use.

Kiwanis Club of Des Plaines, Illinois – Shoe/Boot Program - Vouchers are provided by a local shoe store to low income families to purchase new shoes or boots for the children.

Kiwanis Club of Hollywood/Los Feliz, California – USC Mobile Dental Clinic – Funding to bring a mobile dental clinic to this community.

Kiwanis Club of Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia – Project 7 – Providing educational expenses and developmental toys to the Kiwanis Down Syndrome Foundation – National Centre in Malaysia

Kiwanis Club of La Hormiga, Colombia – A Hope for Infancy: Seeds of Peace – Provides child developmental classes for young children in the Rincones de Paz community.

Kiwanis Club of Miles City, Montana – Bring the Children into the Light – Providing tables, chairs, desks and portable shelving for the Miles City Public Library.

Kiwanis Club of Oakridge, Oregon – Snack Pack for Kids – This program provides healthy snacks that are sent home with children in their backpacks.

Kiwanis Club of the Peninsula at Oyster Point, Virginia – Books for Orphaned and Incarcerated Children in Central America – Providing books for libraries in Central American countries of El Salvador and Honduras.

Kiwanis Club of Santo Domingo, Ecuador – Centro Medico Hombro a Hombro – This grant will provide a truck to help with transportation of patients of the Central Medico Hombro a Hombro project for children and their mothers in Ecuador.

Kiwanis Club of Valparaiso-Sunrise, Indiana – A Child’s Path to a Healthy Relationship Style – This program provides a series of parenting classes for new parents of children birth to 3 years.

The Kiwanis International Foundation Board of Trustees approved these grants at its June 2009 meeting in Nashville, Tennessee:

Glenwood Springs Key Club, Colorado – Netaiken Elementary Schools– The Key Club at Glenwood Springs will help provide the three Netaiken Elementary Schools in Papua, Indonesia with school supplies, desks, chairs, classroom libraries, computers, and uniforms with this grant.

Kiwanis Club of Belton, Texas – Reaching Children in India through Science – The Belton Kiwanis Club will purchase science equipment for ALFA Elementary School in Yelahanka, Bangalore, India.

This science equipment will provide excellent hands on education for over 500 children in science and prepare the children for university.

Kiwanis Club of Bristol, Virginia – Operation Eradication – This grant will help save lives of children by eradicating life threatening parasites. One hundred percent of this grant will be spent on Albendazole, a medicine that will kill parasites that consume over 30% of the food digested by a child, basically stealing the food away from the child.

Kiwanis Club of Keila, Estonia – Welcome to Estonia 2009 Camp - The European Kiwanis Youth Summer Meeting is organized by Kiwanis clubs from Estonia and Finland. The Youth Meeting creates a collaboration network and creates friendships between youth from different countries, language study, practicing teamwork and getting to know local nature and cultural values.

Kiwanis Club of Jeremie, Haiti – Bon Samaritan School – The Club began sponsoring 100 children last year in this elementary school, providing and education, school uniforms, and a warm meal a day. This funding will continue that support by providing school supplies.

Kiwanis Club of Oakmont, California – After Hours School – This is a gang prevention after school program that offers homework help, tutoring, mentoring, reading, health education, recreation, sports leagues, career preparation, and field trips for at-risk youth.

Kiwanis Club of Rapid City, South Dakota – Helping Youth Walk in Their Shoes – Shoes and socks for close to 300 middle school children will be provided for students at North Middle School in Rapid City, South Dakota.

Kiwanis Club of Richmond, Virginia – Camp Little Hawk – The Kiwanis Club, along with the Boys & Girls club, sponsor over 300 children to attend a summer camping experience. This grant will help supply the camp with food and activity supplies such as kick balls, footballs, archery supplies, fishing poles, life vests, pool noodles and arts & crafts.

Kiwanis Club of Sioux Falls Daybreak, SD – Spinoza Bear – This project provides children experiencing major physical and/or emotional upheavals in their young lives with a warm fuzzy friend known as the Spinoza bear. The children who receive one of these bears desperately need the support of a “friend” who speaks or sings directly to them with a gentle voice, understands their need for comfort and provides them with the security of a warm hug.

Kiwanis International – Service Leadership Programs – To provide support for Key Leader conferences, CKI Leadership Academy, Key Club International Leadership Conference, and to continue the matching grant program for Akton Club’s Sleeping Children Around The World (SCAW).

The Kiwanis International Foundation Board of Trustees approved these grants at its January 2009 meeting in Indianapolis, Indiana:

Kiwanis Club of Brunswick, Georgia – Ferst Foundation Literacy Project: The Ferst Literacy project will assist children to be reading ready before entering kindergarten by providing age appropriate books to all children from new born to five years of age.

Kiwanis Club of Canby, Oregon – Olive Tree Children’s Ministry: Club members and local Key Clubbers, Builders Club members and K-kids deliver backpacks full of school supplies to the impoverished children of Ensenada, Mexico. This grant will purchase backpack and school supplies.

Kiwanis Club of Colonial Plymouth, Michigan – Kids Against Hunger: The Kids Against Hunger project is a humanitarian effort to package and provide impoverished children worldwide with nutritious meals. Club members and local Circle K member will assemble these packets on Kiwanis One Day, April 4, 2009.

Kiwanis Club of Colombia Golden K, South Carolina – Best Feet Forward: This project provides gift certificates from a shoe manufacturer to needy children and enable 50 Kindergarten – 2nd graders to buy new shoes for school.

Kiwanis Children of Des Plaines, Illinois – Shoe/Boot Project: Vouchers are provided by a local shoe store to low income families to purchase new shoes or boots for the children. This project will help 245 children.

Kiwanis Club of Early Risers of Worthington, Minnesota – Kiwanis Baby Cupboard: Club members stock a local food pantry with baby foods, diapers, and supplies.

Kiwanis Club of Lincoln SouthPointe, Nebraska – Lincoln Back Packs: Backpacks are given to needy children on the weekends filled with food and fresh fruit to feed them for several days.

The Kiwanis International Foundation Board of Trustees approved these grants at its June 2008 meeting in Orlando, Florida:

Kiwanis Belgium-Luxembourg District –Kiwanis School Kinshasa: The Belgium-Luxembourg District, working with SOS Children Village organization, will provide an education to 150 orphans in a new facility in Kinshasa, Congo in Central Africa. Within this facility, the primary school will provide a quality primary scholar education, including French and English language.

Kiwanis Club of Dasmarias Central, (Philippines) – Feed the Hungry: This grant will help the club provide rice and medicine to the malnourished children in Dasmarias, Philippines by providing a feeding program three times a week.

Kiwanis Club of Ibarra (Ecuador) – Jardin de Infantes-Aguilar Pozo: Club members provide a primary education to 50 children in an economically depressed area. This grant will help provide school supplies, office supplies, and teachers.

Kiwanis Club of Milford (Ohio) – Positive Parenting Program: The Positive Parenting Program is a 10-week group program that teaches parenting strategies to promote the child's development and manage misbehavior. This parenting program aims to prevent severe behavioral, emotional and developmental problems in children by enhancing the knowledge, skills and confidence of parents.

Kiwanis Club of Owatonna (Minnesota) – Blankets for Noor Eye Clinic: This funding will provide 300 blankets for the Noor Eye clinic in Afghanistan. The Noor Eye Clinic treats over 100,000 children a year for eye problems. Hospitals are not very well heated and the children suffer from the cold temperate. These blankets will be purchased from local vendors, helping to support the local community.

Kiwanis Club of Richland (Washington) – Surgical Implant Generation Network (SIGN): The SIGN clinics provide surgical implants to victims of bone fractures in developing countries. This grant will be able to replace implant materials and provide support to three surgical sites. This project will impact about 500 children.

Kiwanis Club of Sentinel (Montana) – Destiny Orphanage and Boarding School: The orphanage serves over 900 children in Kampala, Uganda. This grant will be used to meet the needs of the children including food, beds, blankets, transportation, and books.

Switzerland-Liechtenstein District – Tirana Children's Hospital in Albania: Various Kiwanis clubs in the districts search for surplus hospital furniture. The furniture is disassembled, repaired, packaged and transported to Albanian hospitals for the use of children staying in the hospitals. This grant will assist over 150 children by providing transportation and repair costs associated with this project.

The Kiwanis International Foundation Board of Trustees approved these grants at its January 2008 meeting in Indianapolis, Indiana:

Kiwanis Club of Birmingham Central (Michigan) – Rest, Educate, Motivate Project: The objective of the R.E. M. (rest, educate, motivate) project is to teach at-risk elementary school children, ages 5-12, the importance of sleep and good sleep habits. Providing a bedtime kit with sleeping essentials and educating the students and their families of the importance of a good night's sleep can institute change in the lives of children. An adult size sleeping bag will provide warmth and personal space. A nightshirt and stuffed animal will provide comfort. The dental kit will encourage healthy teeth and general good health. These basic provisions will provide each child with the supplies to have a restful sleep.

Kiwanis Club of Florence (Alabama) – Baby's First Months DVD: Baby's First Months is a DVD, which provides instructions for care of newborns and postpartum care for parents. This educational aid assists with the hospital to home transition and answers the question, "What do we do now?" Topics include physical care of the newborn, newborn safety, dealing with crying and colic, coping with parent frustration, and shaken baby syndrome. This DVD will be given to parents by hospital staff prior to their discharge from the hospital.

Kiwanis Club of Gilmer (Texas) – Adios Lombrices or Goodbye Worms: Worms prosper where there is poverty, poor sanitation, poor access to health care and a high level of illiteracy. These conditions exist in Guatemala today. Guatemala has a population of approximately 14 million people, and 4.5 million are children. Adios Lombrices plans to de-worm 75% of the 4.5 million children in Guatemala, ages 2 to 15, over a three-year period. This will be accomplished through a school-based program outlined by the World Health Organization (WHO) using a safe, easy to administer chewable tablet.

Kiwanis Club of Greenhills-Forest Park (Ohio) – Safety Rocks: The Safety Rocks program is designed to capture the attention of 3 to 5 year olds. The 30-45 minute presentation includes a short video stressing situations and objects that can be a danger to children. The video teaches the children how to avoid these hazards. As part of the program, Kiwanians read the children a book on home safety. Each child receives a coloring book and a home safety tip sheet to take home to their parents. Daycare centers receive an interactive safety poster and can receive a packet provided by the Kiwanis Club that contains the video and storybooks used in the program.

Kiwanis Club of Hanover (Pennsylvania) – Bulgarian Orphanage: The Bulgarian Orphanage and Medical Relief Fund provide medicines to as many of the approximately 9,000 children in Bulgarian Orphanages on an annual basis. The project has been providing aid through donations of medicines and medical supplies from area hospitals, doctors, and individuals since 1992. Distribution of these life saving medicines has resulted in a significantly lower death rate.

Kiwanis Club of Riverside Arlington (California) – The NineZero Project: Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders (FASD), caused by prenatal exposure to alcohol is the number one cause of intellectual and many other disabilities in the U.S. and the Western world, yet is 100% preventable. This project provides information and education to young people to help them avoid this hazardous behavior. NineZero stands for nine months, zero alcohol.

Kiwanis Club of Stuttgart (Arkansas) – Kiwanis Backpacks for Kids: This program provides children in-need with food for the weekends when they do not have access to free or reduced lunches. The children, pre-school to the fourth grade, receive backpacks filled with nutritious, easy-to-prepare foods each Friday afternoon.

Kiwanis Club of Twin City (North Carolina) – Children of Vietnam Mending Hearts: Children of Vietnam currently has a waiting list of over 200 children with life threatening heart conditions. Heart surgery would give these children a chance to reach adulthood. The COV staff interviews each family for need, assists in arranging medical exams and surgery, coordinates with medical personnel throughout the process, makes a post operation visit to the home of each child, and assists in bringing the child for checkups.

The Kiwanis International Foundation Board of Trustees approved these grants at its October 2007 meeting in Indianapolis, Indiana:

Kiwanis Club of Aurora Golden K, (Illinois) – Hope in Motion project: The Hope Wall school serves over 300 children with special needs ranging from mild to severe and profound. The Hope in Motion project will give these children the opportunity to have a safe playground area to accommodate their physical needs and is accessible to their equipment. The accessible playscape can potentially solve many individual developmental needs and help students attain their Individual Education Plan (IEP) goals at the Hope D. Wall school by improving social and emotional interaction, meeting fine and gross motor therapy goals, and developing communication through play-based therapy.

Kiwanis Club of Des Plaines, (Illinois) – Shoe/Boot Project: The Kiwanis Club of Des Plaines has provided shoes or boots to local elementary school children for the past 6 years at no cost to their families. Over these years the program has provided shoes or boots to over 600 children. This grant will allow the club to continue to support the growing needs of this project.

Kiwanis Club of Jeremie, (Haiti): This project will sponsor 100 children in the community of Jeremie, Haiti to attend elementary school. This grant will assist by providing teachers, a daily meal, and school uniforms.

Kiwanis Club of Waynesboro, (Virginia): The Kiwanis Club of Waynesboro and the Capital District Foundation support this project that will assist the Augusta Regional Dental Clinic in the provision of preventative, restorative, extractive oral health care and educational services.
